

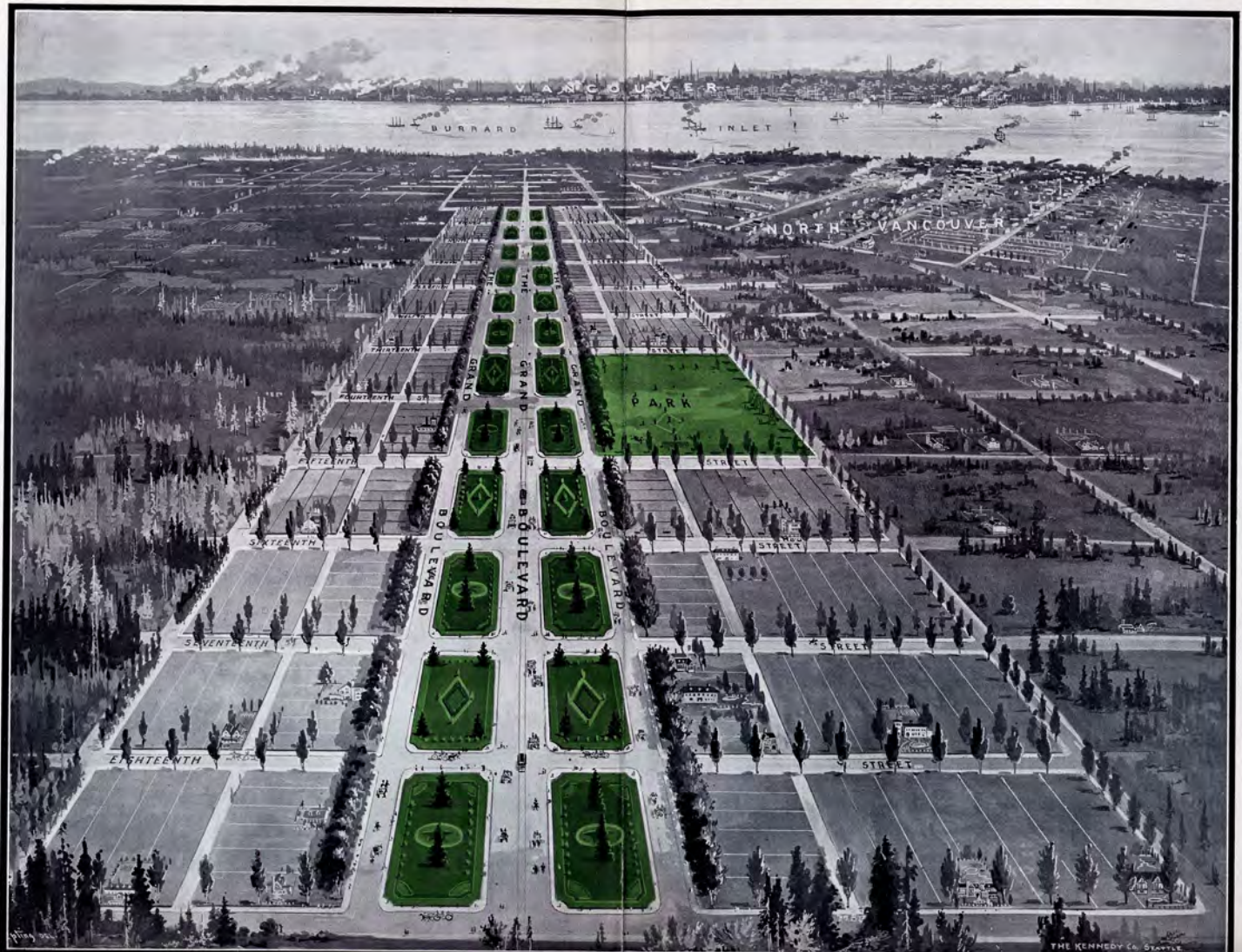

Prize for a student in the 1st or 2nd year is \$750

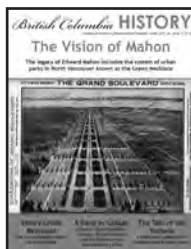
Prize for a student in the 3rd or 4th year is \$1,000
